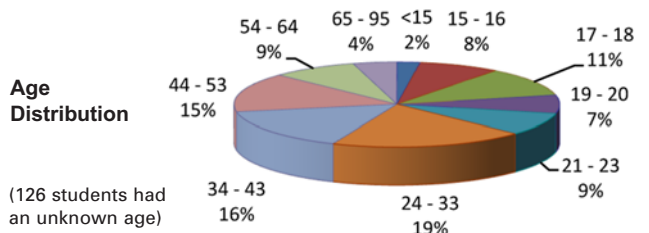

By Student Age Demographics*

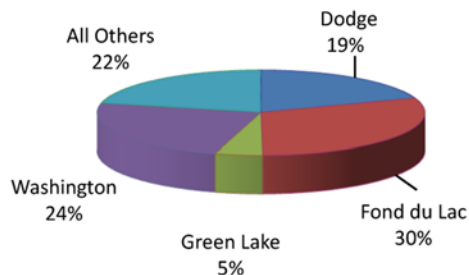

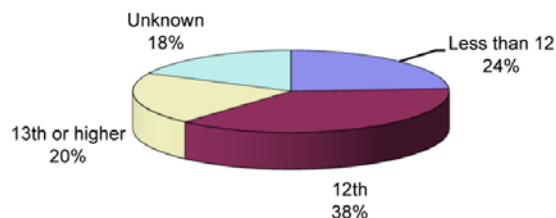

Client file excludes course activity for aid types of 3, 6, 89 or non-FTE generating courses or activities such as internal MPTC staff courses and community courses like painting, ceramics, etc. Client file also excludes course withdrawals of 80% and 100% and grades of X, Z and O.

***Overall Headcount includes transcribed credit high school students and incarcerated population but excludes activities.

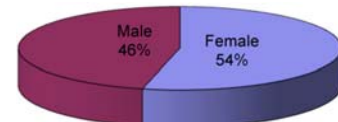

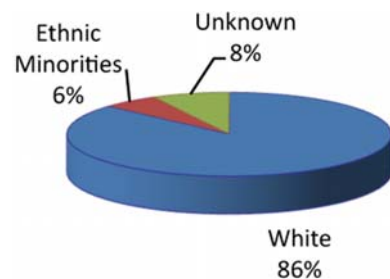
By Gender*
