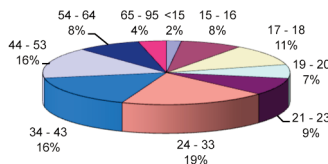

#### Age Distribution



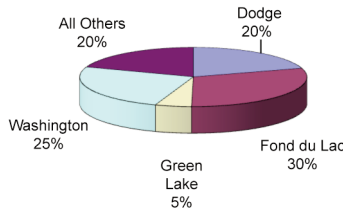

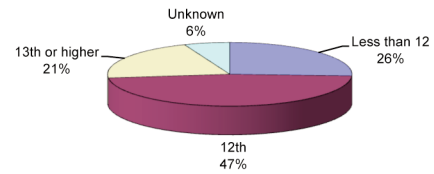

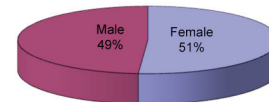

### By Highest Grade Completed\*



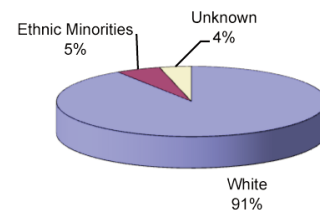
